RE-ENROLLMENT FOR THE 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR (SEPT. – MID-JUNE)

The re-enrollment deadline is fast approaching. Here are answers to the questions we are asked most frequently. Please call us if there is anything else you wish to know about re-enrolling your child. This information also is available on our website: www.sammamishmontessori.com.

- 1. Question:** I would like my child to continue to attend Sammamish Montessori School next year. Do I need to re-enroll?
Answer: YES, ALL RETURNING STUDENTS MUST RE-ENROLL. We need you to let us know your plans for next year and have your commitment if you would like us to reserve a space for your child for the 2017-2018 school year.
- 2. Question:** When can I enroll my child?
Answer: The enrollment deadline for returning students and their siblings is February 6, 2017. You may submit your paperwork anytime up until that day to be part of the re-enrollment process. If your application is received after February 6, 2017 your registration will be processed in the order it is received.
- 3. Question:** When can my neighbor enroll?
Answer: The enrollment process begins in January, however placements of new families will begin after the deadline for returning families has passed and will continue until all available spots are filled. New student enrollment paperwork may be turned in anytime but will not be processed until we have completed re-enrollments for returning families after the February 6, 2017 deadline.
- 4. Question:** What is the amount of the deposit due to secure a space for the 2017-2018 school year?
Answer: Tuition is a school year program fee that may be paid in a lump sum or divided into ten (paid monthly) installments for your convenience. It is calculated on the total number of actual school days in the school year and does not include holidays, vacations, in-service, and conference days so that you are paying only for actual school days. When you enroll your child for the school year, you are making a commitment for the entire school year from the first day of school in September through the last day of school in June (or if you enroll mid-year from your start date through the last day of the school year in June).

To secure a space for the 2017-2018 school year 10% of the annual tuition must be paid upon registration as a nonrefundable deposit, along with the \$190 re-registration fee. Tuition payments for the balance of the school year are outlined in the following table:

5. Question: How do I enroll?

Answer: Complete the re-enrollment contract and attach either a check, or give your credit card number and authorization to charge registration fees and tuition deposits (registration fee (\$190) plus your tuition deposit of 10% of annual tuition.) Forms must be filled out completely, signed and accompanied by payment in order to be eligible to process. You may choose to mail in your registration and payment so that it is received on or before Friday, February 6, 2017 or deliver it by hand. (Please do not send in your child's school bag.)

All registrations received by February 6, 2017 will be collected and on the following day applications will be processed in priority order. Priority is given to full day students and then to half day students. Applications received after February 6, 2017 will be processed in the order they are received.

6. Question: Can I get another registration form for a sibling, friend or neighbor?

Answer: Yes. Just come in to the office, or call and we can put a form in your child's bag, mail or email one as needed. You may also download a registration form from our website www.sammamishmontessori.com. Children enrolled in the school (and siblings or alumni) pay a registration/enrollment fee of \$190 and are given priority (assuming forms are turned in by the deadline). The registration fee for new families is \$250; processing for new students occurs after returning students have been registered. Please let us know which form you need.

7. Question: Can I enroll if I complete the form and send in payment later?

Answer: No. We cannot process an enrollment request until payment is received, even if paperwork is submitted. You may provide a credit card number and authorization instead of a check if you prefer. If you are registering more than one child and need to make payment arrangements, please contact our Director or Business Manager.

8. Question: Do I need a separate registration form if I am enrolling more than one child?

Answer: Yes. By law each child enrolled in school must have a separate enrollment contract.

9. Question: What are the benefits of staying at SMS for the kindergarten year?

Answer: The third year, or kindergarten year, is when all the learning that has taken place in the previous two years reaches fruition. Children build upon what they have learned, experience rapid academic and social growth and their skill level dramatically increases. Third year/kindergarten students are ready to explore more complex learning and discovery and they need a wealth of new and interesting materials to keep them stimulated. They are guided to take on more and more complex work, begin to learn time management skills and have an increased set of expectations and privileges in the classroom. As well as this, these older children can reinforce their academic skills by helping another child, a well-documented way to consolidate knowledge.

Your child has been unconsciously looking forward to being one of the "big kids" in the classroom. If he/she is put into a school where the kindergartners are looked down upon as being in the "baby class" his/her cycle of maturing is interrupted. It is especially unfortunate for a child who is a younger sibling at home to miss this opportunity to shine. This year of leadership gives a child immeasurable self-esteem and intellectual confidence.

Another advantage of staying at this school for kindergarten is that his/her teacher already knows your child very well so no time is lost at the beginning of the year trying to assess him/her. Be sure to speak to your child's teacher about kindergarten during conferences. The gift of this third year can never be taken away and it sets up a child for future academic and social success. Please also attend one of our parent meetings regarding kindergarten and talk with parents of current kindergarten students or those who have now graduated into higher grades about their experience. We are happy to put you in touch with other parents.

10. Question: Can I register my child for kindergarten even if he/she is not 5 years old by August 31, 2017?

Answer: No. However, your child will have the opportunity to do kindergarten level work and beyond in any of the Montessori classrooms even if registered as a preschool student. Parents of children with early September birthdays who have attended a Montessori school for two years and wish to petition for their child's third Montessori year to be their kindergarten year may submit a request in writing to the director prior to registration. Your child will be evaluated by your child's teacher during the first month of school and a determination will be made at the first conference in October. Early acceptance into kindergarten at SMS is not a guarantee of early acceptance into a public school the following year.

11. Question: What are the benefits of my child continuing in the SMS elementary?

Answer: Sammamish Montessori's rigorous elementary program is designed to maintain continuity with the preschool

and kindergarten programs and is designed to work with individual students to meet or exceed state grade level curriculum standards. We provide a continuing strong academic curriculum where children's work is closely monitored and students are stretched to achieve their potential. The fundamental tenet of the elementary program is that children will learn to manage their own time. We encourage them to think for themselves both logically and creatively and under the guidance of our highly experienced Montessori elementary teachers. This period is one in which the child has an insatiable appetite for knowledge and, thus, the goal of our teachers is to create an environment that encourages the pursuit of excellence in all facets of the child's work; to stimulate a sense of curiosity and to encourage the development of independence and individual responsibility. Students are encouraged to explore topics they find interesting and apply those interests to assigned work, so developing the necessary self-discipline and responsibility required to reach conclusions and satisfy their curiosity all the while drawing upon and honing their academic skills. They discover for themselves the organization, laws and order that exist within our universe.

12. Question: If I decide to withdraw my child, can I receive a refund? What if I move away during the year?

Answer: Registration fees and tuition deposits are nonrefundable. Enrollment is a commitment for the entire school year and the commitment you make when you enroll your child in turn allows the school to make commitments to teachers and fulfill the many financial obligations the school must take on to provide your child's space in school.

Once your child has been enrolled, we honor our commitment to you by ensuring your child's space for the school year. This often means turning away other students who would have enrolled for your child's space had it been available. For this reason, please make sure you have made your decision to attend Sammamish Montessori School prior to submitting an enrollment contract for your child. Please notify the school in writing as soon as possible (before August 1, 2017) if you plan to withdraw your child from the 2017-2018 school year to release yourself from future tuition obligations.

If you have to withdraw during the school year, you must provide written notice at least one month in advance of the first day of the month of your withdrawal, or if you are unable to provide one-month written notice of withdrawal, you must pay one tuition installment in lieu of notice.

If you have to withdraw prior to the school year, you must inform the school **in writing** by August 1, 2017, otherwise September tuition will be charged on September 1, 2017. If no written notice of withdrawal is received, responsibility for tuition for the entire school year remains regardless of attendance.

13. Question: Is there a discount if I have more than one child in school?

Answer: Yes. If more than one child from the same family attends concurrently, there is a 5% tuition reduction for *each* child.

14. Question: Do I receive a discount if I prepay the tuition for the full year?

Answer: A 3% discount is provided for annual tuition paid in full by September 10, 2017 if paid in cash or by check.

15. Question: Will all of this year's teachers be here next year?

Answer: Our staff turnover has historically been very low and we do our best to provide consistency for students within each classroom. However, at this stage we cannot guarantee who will be here next year as we are in the process of completing our agreements and staffing plans. We will certainly try our best to keep you informed of any changes.

16. Question: Will my child automatically have the same teacher as this year?

Answer: Yes. Your child's social and academic development is part of a three-year Montessori cycle with the same teacher and many of the same classmates so ideally your child will continue in the same class with the same teacher. However, there is a small possibility that unforeseen circumstances may dictate a change. If your child is enrolled in the Prep Class, he/she will move into a Montessori preschool/kindergarten classroom when he/she is ready, either during the school year or the following new school year in the fall.

17. Question: How many days per week can preschool students attend?

Answer: Montessori preschool/kindergarten classes are five days per week. Our Enrichment program can accommodate students who are enrolled five half days in a Montessori class to add one, two, three, four or five half days in addition to their five half day schedule. There may be a limited number of four-day afternoon spaces for preschool aged children available in our Montessori preschool program unless all spaces have been taken by students attending five days per week. Kindergarten students must attend five days per week. Students who are not yet 3 years old or are 3 years old but not ready for a preschool program may enroll two, three or five half days per week in our Prep Class.

18. Question: If I am enrolling a sibling, may I request a particular teacher?

Answer: As a returning family, you may request a teacher and we will try to honor your request, however, if one class becomes overloaded with either boys or girls, we reserve the right to equal out the numbers and we try our best to keep an optimal balance of ages. Keep in mind that there is always a small chance that a teacher's plans to stay may change due to unforeseen circumstances.

19. Question: When will I know if I get what I requested?

Answer: If we cannot meet your request, we will contact you within two weeks to discuss any available options you may have. If you do not hear from us initially, you may assume your child is enrolled. Confirmations will be sent out along with Summer School registrations in late March.

20. Question: At what age can my child enroll?

Answer: Our Prep Class is designed for our youngest students starting at age 2-1/2. (See class description below.)

20. Question: Am I required to volunteer or fundraise for the school? I hear many schools require a lot of fundraising and volunteer help.

Answer: No. We do not fundraise for our school. When you enroll in our school you pay only your registration fee, tuition, nominal field trip expenses, and any daycare charges you incur for actual time used. Furthermore, volunteering at our school is exactly that: voluntary. We appreciate and encourage parent involvement in a number of ways (reading parent, special projects, field-trip chaperone, celebrations, and lunchtime volunteers). Be sure to inquire about our volunteer discount available to parents who sign up for our volunteer lunch helper program.

21. Question: What classes are available?

PROGRAMS OFFERED

Prep Program (Ages 2-1/2 to 3)

Our Prep program is for new students ages 2-1/2 to 3 years old. It is offered as a two, three or five morning per week program (2 days on Th/F, 3 days on M/T/W only). The goal of the Prep Program is to help younger students learn social and emotional skills to prepare themselves to join a Montessori preschool/kindergarten class. Students enrolled in the Prep program may enroll in the Montessori preschool program the following school year or may be ready to join a preschool program during the course of the school year (if a space is available) as determined by the Prep Teacher and School Director in conjunction with the child's parents.

Preschool-Kindergarten (age 3-6) Montessori Class:

Students may attend morning and/or afternoon five days per week. In each group, children learn at the pace most comfortable for them without the pressure of competition. (A limited number of four-day afternoon spaces for preschool aged children may be available unless all spaces have been taken by students attending five days/week.) The advantage of a mixed age-group is that children can work with those younger or older than themselves, according to their skills, yet still mix socially with children of their own age. This works well for children who function academically at one age-level and socially at another. It enables kindergarten-age children to experience a year of leadership in a class with a familiar teacher.

Elementary Montessori:

Every child in this class works at his/her own rate and the curriculum is designed to accommodate all abilities within this age-range and skill level. All children will be academically challenged to work at their level and above and given individualized attention for their specific needs. Curriculum encompasses reading, math, language, geography, science, music, foreign language, P.E., art, art history, creative and research writing, poetry, oral presentation, penmanship, and sign-language, music, Spanish, and computer lessons.

Computer: All preschool-kindergarten students receive computer instruction in a separate computer lab as part of their regular school curriculum. Computer lessons are given once per week; morning and afternoon students attend two sessions per week. This is provided at no extra charge to you. The elementary classroom also has a computer students use for research and projects.

Foreign Language: A foreign language lesson is given once a week in each preschool/kindergarten classroom (morning and afternoon) by a fluent, bilingual language teacher who uses songs, stories, puppetry and a variety of other methods to facilitate learning. Elementary students have longer more in-depth oral and written Spanish language lessons.

Music: Our music teacher visits each preschool/kindergarten classroom once a week (morning and afternoon) to sing with the children, introduce various musical instruments, teach basic principals of music instruction, discuss the origins and history of music, and introduce various composers and music genres. Elementary students have small group music lessons each week which span singing, music and movement, music history and compositors, genres and instruments, and beginning to read music in order to learn to play the recorder.

Morning and Afternoon Enrichment Classes (ages 3-6):

These are specialized classes for intellectually curious children who are enrolled in a half-day Montessori program and would like to attend Enrichment classes *in addition* to regular morning or afternoon classes. Preschool or kindergarten students may be enrolled in Enrichment class for 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 days a week in addition to Montessori class. The Enrichment program is a perfect complement to our Montessori classes. Our Enrichment teachers give our students opportunities to increase their academic skills through hands-on activities and experiments in a setting that allows for greater in-depth exploration of particular topics than may be possible in a Montessori classroom. Enrichment classes are structured as a theme for each day of the week.

Early Birds/After School Club (Ages 3 to 10)

Extended care is available to all SMS students enrolled in preschool, kindergarten or elementary programs. Early Birds hours are from 7:30 a.m. until morning class and After School Club is available from the end of afternoon class until 6:15 p.m. Monday through Friday. This flexible option allows you to drop off and pick up your child at a time that is most convenient for you.

In Early Birds/After School Club children are free to choose from a wide range of individual or group work under the supervision of our own teachers and aides. Children may work on arts and crafts projects, read books, play with toys, play games, listen to stories, participate in special projects, engage in group or individual activities, sing songs and listen to various types of music, or play on the playground and in the indoor gym areas.

Lunchbunch is held from 11:30AM-12:45PM for full day children. Children bring a lunch (perishables with a cold pack; hot items in a thermos).
